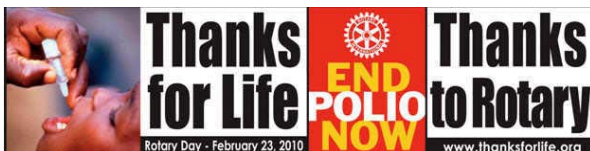


## Rotary Youth Leadership Awards
