

# Generous villagers in Flamborough dig deep for the Philippines disaster appeal

Generous villagers in Flamborough who donated hundreds of pounds to pay for emergency boxes to help those dealing with the Philippines disaster.

Villagers donated £590, which was then increased to £750, by the Bridlington Rotary Club, after Flamborough man Terry Waite organised a collection.

This money will pay for three Rotary emergency boxes which contain basic essentials such as shelter, bedding, clothing, cooking utensils, water filters and basic medication for people who have become homeless.

Rotary Disaster Aid volunteers were on the scene in the

Philippines within days to distribute these boxes amongst the victims.

Terry, 77, said: "We collected on a Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday outside the Rose and Crown and at shops around the village. We raised £1,400 for the tsunami in 2004, and once again the people of Flamborough have showed their generosity."

A certificate of appreciation for 'the people of Flamborough' was sent by Disaster Aid UK & Ireland.

A spokesperson for Rotary thanked people in Flamborough for their donations and Terry Waite for taking the time to collect the fantastic amount.
