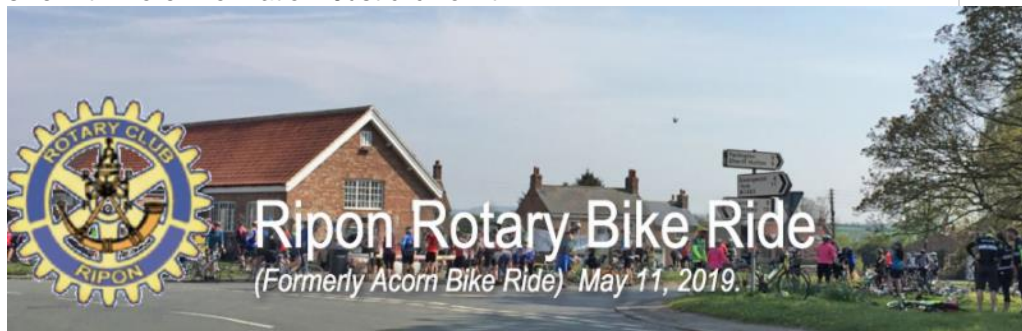

Cavaliers are Walking for Water

 Women walking up to 10km twice a day for essential water

Our International project for 2019 continues to bring safe water to 3000 people in six remote communities in Ghana. Presently, women and sometimes children spend many hours every day collecting water, most of it unclean.

Women have little time to fulfil their potential, tend crops or care for their children.

Hand operated filters are first installed in each community to enable them to produce enough safe water to drink. As funds become available, the filters are superseded by boreholes, giving abundant safe water at the heart of the community.

Women and children will have time to achieve their potential and lead meaningful lives.

Working with trusted partners in Ghana, the Rotary Club of Scarborough Cavaliers has so far installed six filters and last year one community received a borehole, two more are in progress. This year our sponsored walk aims to bring a borehole to a fourth community.

The circular 5.3mile walk begins at the Hayburn Wyke Inn and heads through woodlands and along the Cleveland Way then returns along the Cinder Track. The Inn offers high quality food and drink at the end of the trek, if you wish. The woodland offers the chance to watch wildlife, with roe deer, badgers and foxes commonly found in the area.

The walk starts at 10.00 on Sunday 12 May at the Hayburn Wyke Inn just off the Ravenscar road, north of Scarborough

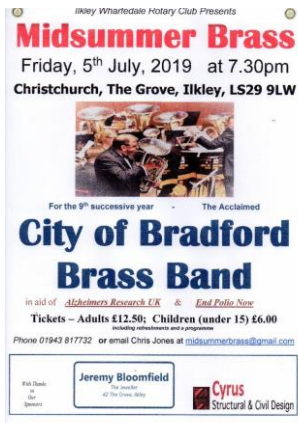

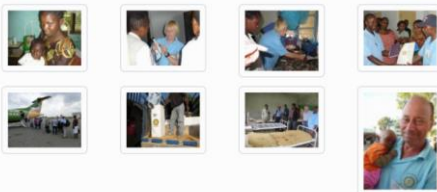
