Applicants are invited to submit a bid outlining their proposed project by 21 November 2018. **Shortlisted candidates will be invited to the Rotary 'Bid 4 Awards' evening to pitch their ideas to a judging panel, in front of an invited audience, on Thursday 17th January 2019 at The Holiday Inn, Kenilworth.** The Awards are being organised by our Networking & Projects Group who meet monthly, judges will include corporate members Band Hatton Button LLP and The Holiday Inn of Kenilworth.

Our aim is to encourage local people to come together to give their time for the benefit the local community. The sort of projects that groups and individuals may consider could include such ideas as planting a community garden or establishing a children's play area, for example.
